We are writing to provide you with an update on your Aviva Car Insurance policy in the event of a 'Hard Brexit' on the 29th of March. A Hard Brexit is a scenario where the UK including Northern Ireland exits the EU without agreeing a withdrawal agreement (including transition arrangements) with the EU.

If a 'Hard Brexit' scenario occurs, motor insurance policyholders from the Republic of Ireland driving their car in the UK will require an internationally recognised insurance document to verify that they have valid motor insurance – known as a 'Green Card'. This 'Green Card' will be required if you are stopped by law enforcement authorities in the UK. Therefore, in the event of a Hard Brexit we strongly advise that if and when you drive to the UK or Northern Ireland you carry a Green Card.

To prepare you for a 'Hard Brexit' scenario, we have enclosed a Green Card specifically covering the car specified on your motor insurance policy. This card is valid until your next renewal date (unless your policy has been cancelled during the period for which it was issued, or you have lapsed your policy prior to receiving this letter). Please keep this document in a safe place.

When will I know if I need a Green Card?

A Green Card is only required if a 'Hard Brexit' scenario takes place. EU and the UK political leaders remain engaged in negotiation about how and when the UK will withdraw from the EU. You will be fully aware from media outlets what will take place on the March 29th. Aviva are ensuring now that you are prepared for Brexit, considering the three main scenarios as follows;

1. The UK exits from the EU without an agreed withdrawal agreement – resulting in the requirement for you to carry the attached Green Card when you drive in the UK.
2. The UK exits from the EU with an agreed withdrawal agreement in place– resulting in no requirement for a Green Card when you drive in the UK.
3. The UK exit from the EU is postponed for a defined period– resulting in no requirement for a Green Card when you drive in the UK.
